

Sample clauses for wording your bequest

Proper wording is vital to the validity of a bequest. World Vision recommends the following will clauses for your use:

Specific amount bequest:

“I DIRECT my trustee(s) to pay the sum of _____ DOLLARS (\$ _____) to WORLD VISION CANADA, currently located at 1 World Drive, Mississauga, Ontario L5T 2Y4, for its general purposes. The receipt of an appropriate officer of World Vision Canada shall be a sufficient discharge of my Trustee(s).”

Residual bequest:

“I DIRECT my trustee(s) to pay _____ (*insert number that equates to percentage*) parts of the residue of my estate to WORLD VISION CANADA, currently located at 1 World Drive, Mississauga, Ontario L5T 2Y4, for its general purposes. The receipt of an appropriate officer of World Vision Canada shall be a sufficient discharge of my Trustee(s).”

We encourage you to direct planned gifts to community relief and development programs, rather than to a sponsored child. In this way, you'll impact entire communities and generations of children. You may, however, direct your bequest to the child sponsorship program, or allow us to use it where it is most needed at the time received.
